- □ Social Economies can only thrive in an ecosystem with conditions that support their development
- We call this set of conditions "Support Structures"
- ☐ This module aims at presenting the plurality and connections of the support structures necessary for the emergence and reinforcement of social economy.

Theme 1 - An analytical framework for SE support structures

- Introduction to the analytical framework used to categorise and assess the main SE support structures:
- (i) Top-down supporting mechanisms
- (ii) Support structures from the bottom-up
- (iii) Local conditions
- This session will explain and initiate the Phase A of the board game

Theme 2 - First Pillar: Top-down supporting mechanisms (2 sessions)

- The first pillar refers all those actors and institutions that support the social economy from a position outside the field. Examples include:
 - National legislation and legislative innovation
 - Supporting schemes provided by the local authorities
 - EU and other international supporting mechanisms
 - Private foundations
 - University and other HEI's supporting schemes
- Non-SE civic society organizations and financial support schemes

Theme 3 - Second Pillar: Support structures from the bottom-up (2 sessions)

- The second pillar includes all supportive structures that are being created from the bottom up, from the SE organizations for the development and strengthening of the social economy. Examples include:
 - Local and regional networks
 - **SE Incubators**
 - Cooperative and ethical banking
 - Informal solidarity hubs
- **Crowdfunding campaigns**

Theme 4 - Third Pillar: Local conditions (2 sessions)

- □ The third pillar includes context-specific physical or cultural conditions historically developed in a place that can support or hinder the development of Social Economy. Examples:
 - Traditional forms of cooperative provisioning and local commons
 - Imaginaries of frugal abundance and gift-exchanging customs
 - Physical geography that can foster cooperation (e.g. insularity)
 - Crises, social movements and mobilizations
 - Broader political change, favourable political conditions

Theme 5: Connections and relationships

- This theme will try to bring those threads together, by focusing on the connections between the individual structures and policies
- Support structures cannot be viewed as a sum of distinct entities but as an emerging whole with multiple, and at times contradictory dynamics.
- Theme 5 is complemented with a move to the Phase B of the Board Game

Theme 6: Looking ahead

- ☐ Theme 6 looks into the future and introduces elements of deliberative visioning
- Using real case examples, we will move beyond the description of a present situation, into exploring the transgressive dynamics of reshaping the future

☐ Theme 6 is complemented with moving to the final Phase C of the Board Game

- Understand the multiplicity of conditions that foster or hinder the development of Social Economy.
- Familiarise with the main types of support structures following the analytical framework provided and critically evaluate strong points and shortcomings.
